COVID-19

Thank you to everyone for following the Government guidelines and for wearing your masks when dropping off and collecting your children during this lockdown period. It has been fun seeing all of the different designs.

We are so proud with how well the children have adapted to the changes that we have had to implement to comply with the guidelines. The pre-school will keep updated with any changes that are required and will endeavour to remain open.

To reduce congestion and encourage social distancing at the end of the day the pre-school will be opening the gates at 3:00 for parents / carers to collect their children. Please can we remind parents / carers that the pre-school finishes at 3:15 and children need to be collected by this time. The team are required to carry out an intense cleaning routine at the end of the day which is why it is important for children to collected on time. Should an issue arise that means that you are unable to collect on time please can you contact the pre-school to make the team aware.

If your child has any of the following symptoms, please keep them home, book a COVID-19 test and inform us of the result as soon as possible.

- High temperature
- Persistent cough
- Loss of taste or smell

UPCOMING EVENTS

Parking

Please may we ask you to park considerately and not block resident's driveways. We have received complaints from residents regarding blocked access to properties, so we ask you to bear this in mind when you are parking outside the school.

If you choose to park in the surrounding streets, please park sensibly and safely by:

- Not parking on the pavements
- Not blocking driveways
- Not mounting grass verges or parking on open spaces
- Not obstructing access, especially for delivery and emergency vehicles

The Police regularly patrol the local area and will issue fixed penalty tickets to vehicles if they are repeatedly found to be obstructing the pavements or driveways.

Parent and Carers are also welcome to park at Totton & Eling Cricket Club before and after school to keep Lydlynch Road a little bit clearer and safer.

Important Information

Please ensure all bags, lunchboxes, water bottles, clothes, hats, sun creams and toys are **<u>NAMED</u>** to avoid lost property. If one of your child's belongings is misplaced, please look in the lost property box, located on the lunch trolley at drop off and pick up time.

If your child is likely to be absent, please inform us by 9am (where possible) by phoning the pre-school.

It is vital that you notify a member of staff when someone else will be collecting your child. Please ensure that the collecting adult has the password that was provided at registration. We will not be able to let your child leave the premises if the proper procedure is not adhered to. Please could we also remind parents/carers that anyone collecting children must be over 18 years of age.

The pre-school encourages healthy eating and therefore would ask that your child's lunch box does not contain fizzy drinks, chocolate, sweets etc. Due to allergies, the pre-school is a nut free zone so please ensure that there are **no products that contain nuts** in your child's lunchbox. Please ensure that grapes and cocktail sausages are cut in half to minimise the risk of choking.

Due to the unpredictability of our weather, please make sure that your child has appropriate outdoor clothing, such as a jacket, wellington boots, hat and sun cream etc. Please note that if your child does not have appropriate outdoor clothing or protection they may be unable to access the outdoor areas.

Team news


